

# Laparoscopic examination

These instructions are intended for printing. The instructions contain sections to be filled in.

The examination is usually performed to determine a cause of pain and/or infertility.

### **Procedure**

The procedure is performed under general anaesthesia using keyhole surgery through a few small incisions. An optical instrument is used to view the condition of the lesser pelvis and, often, the abdominal cavity. To find out the cause of infertility, colouring agent can be injected into the uterus via the vagina to determine openness of the fallopian tubes. The procedure takes approximately 30 minutes.

Recovery from the procedure and anaesthesia takes 4–6 hours on average at the ward.

#### Wound care

The wounds have absorbable sutures, which do not have to be removed. You may shower 24 hours after the surgery. Remove the folded bandages on the wounds before showering. You may go to sauna one week after the procedure when the wounds have healed. Swimming and bathing are allowed 2 weeks after the procedure.

Avoid heavy physical effort during your sick leave. You should avoid intercourse as long as you experience vaginal discharge.

# Treatment of pain

Usually, non-prescription painkillers are enough for home treatment. You may experience stinging pain in your shoulders or arch of ribs (costal arch) on the upper abdomen. These feelings disappear within one or two days. Exercise and, if required, painkillers help.

Sick leave is 3 days.

Follow-up visit is usually arranged to the Gynaecological Outpatient Clinic and in some cases with the referring doctor.
